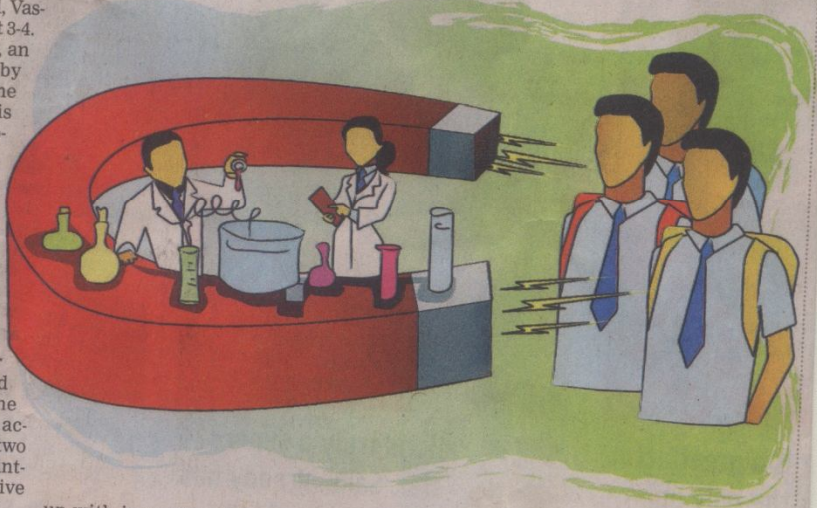
## Testing scientific acumen

**Bloom Public School, Vasant Kunj hosts this year's CBSE Regional Science Exhibit successfully**

The CBSE Regional Science Exhibition at Bloom Public School, VasantKunj, was held on August 3-4. Regional science exhibition, an yearly event, was started by CBSE to incline students towards the practical aspects of science, and this year Bloom Public School got an opportunity to host this prestigious event in which a total of 85 schools participated from Delhi and NCR region. Exhibits were under the following categories: mathematics in everyday life, health, environment, energy and conservation resources, agriculture and disaster management. Each room had four exhibits accompanied by one school teacher and two students. There were six judges appointed by CBSE, experts in their respective field, to judge the best out of the best.

tion went on for two days from 8 am to 5 pm. 160 projects were displayed and 30 were shortlisted. The school from Doha, Qatar and Saudi Arab were delighted and enthusiastic to take part in this event. After a tough decision, the judges eventually declare the 15 best projects from the 30 shortlisted.

Dr Panigrahi, director general of Carbon Minus and advisor to the Prime Minister on environmental issues, gave away the prizes.
