This day is not only her birthday. On this day in 2013, <u>Yousafzai spoke in the United Nations</u> <u>advocating for world wide access to education.</u> She said: "Malala Day is not my day. Today is the day of every woman, every boy, and every girl who have raised their voice for their rights."

Why is Education Important?

Since the dawn of human civilization, education has been a means of teaching the younger generation skills that would help them thrive in <u>society</u>. Education helped and still helps as you get better paying jobs. It improves your critical thinking. In the olden days, these were hands on skills, like pottery and archery. In present times, most high paying jobs require more <u>academic knowledge</u>.


Accessible and Hordable Education
